

Calicivirus Infection

Disease Case Classification	Including: Norwalk, Norwalk-like viruses and other small round structured viruses (SRSVs).
Confirmed Case	Clinical illness ¹ with laboratory confirmation of infection: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Detection of virus in stool by EM, RIA or molecular methods, when available OR <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Greater than fourfold rise in antibody titre to Norwalk virus or Norwalk-like virus in acute and convalescent sera
Probable Case	Clinical illness in a person who is epidemiologically linked to a confirmed case

¹ Clinical illness is characterized by nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, and abdominal pain. Myalgia, headache, malaise, and low-grade fever occur less often.
