Q¹ What does having the right to appeal mean to me?

A If a Public Health decision or order has been made by your Regional Health Authority and you are directly affected and consider yourself aggrieved by that decision, you have the right to appeal to the Public Health Appeal Board.

Q² How do I start the appeal process?

A Let's say that you have received a Public Health decision from your Regional Health Authority that you do not agree with.

From the time you receive the decision, you have 10 days to appeal.

The following steps should be taken:

■ You must get the appeal application form from the **Public Health Appeal Board in Edmonton**, or your Regional Health Authority. This appeal application form is called a "Notice of Appeal".

■ Fill out the Notice of Appeal thoroughly.

■ Return a copy of your Notice of Appeal to the Public Health Appeal Board, and a copy to the Regional Health Authority, within 10 days of receiving the Regional Health Authority's Public Health decision.

Q³ When and where will my hearing take place?

A As the "Appellant," you will be contacted shortly after your Notice of Appeal has been served.

The hearing will then be scheduled within 30 days, or at the earliest possible date, and at the most convenient possible location.

Q⁴ What does appellant mean?

A You are referred to as the "Appellant" if you appeal a Public Health decision or order from a Regional Health Authority.

Q⁵ What authority does the Public Health Appeal Board have?

A In accordance with the Public Health Act, the Public Health Appeal Board has the authority to confirm, reverse or vary the Public Health decision appealed. The Public Health Appeal Board may also refer the matter back to the Regional Health Authority for further consideration or determination.
